- FREE virtual seats for all learners to the educational livestream to kick-off RAP
- A Match to peer group that align in learning level and collaboration criteria
- → Technical support preparing for the virtual visit and facilitating the live event

This will be the 22<sup>nd</sup> year the <u>Center for Interactive Learning and Collaboration (CILC)</u> has sponsored Read Around the Planet in celebration of National Endowment of the Art's Read Across America as well as the United Kingdom's World Book Day. #### Who Needs to Know About Read Around the Planet?


This unique Virtual Learning Event is designed for PreK-12 learners in any in-person, remote, or hybrid learning environments. Spreading the word to the **educators in your school, district, and community** will help attract more student groups for even more dynamic literacy collaborations!

#### **How Does RAP Work?**

After completing the registration form, CILC uses the submitted details to match groups. Educators are connected to their match to plan the best activity for their classroom collaboration. After the RAP Kick-Off Event, groups connect on the planned day and time of their live virtual visit.

#### What is Required From Those Registered?

There is NO COST to participate in Read Around the Planet, all that is required is the following:



Equipment to conduct video call (CILC can provide platform if needed)

Inform their internal team to ensure they have appropriate support

Commitment to participating in the planned RAP programming

After receiving a match, organizing educators should work with their collaborative partners to ...

Meet prior to the RAP Kick-off event to decide on reading activity
Select the day and time for collaboration connection on the week of 6

Conduct a check prior to meeting date to ensure tech and materials are in place

Arrange contingency plans should school or weather cause reschedule

Collecting Information for Registration & Share Teacher Packet

Make sure educators connect with their collaborative partner

> Set-up tech as well as communicate with internal staff for test calls and event

Help teachers prepare their presentation, classroom, engagement, etc.

To ensure a smooth event, it requires you to assist in planning among your educators or schools. Below will provide the important dates, RAP Pro-Tips, and technical information.



### **Important Dates & Links:**

- January 13 February 3, 2023: All can register for NO COST
- February 6-10, 2023: Groups are matched by CILC teams
- On or before February 13, 2023: Matches will be sent via email
- February 24, 2023: The final day to withdraw if necessary
- February 22-March 1, 2023: Conduct Test Call as Partners
- March 6-10, 2023: Read Around the Planet Connections

\*Late Registrations have the potential to be unmatched, please register no later than February 7

#### **RAP Pro-Tips**

Based on feedback from past participants, CILC offers these promising practices in supporting your educators and schools hosting a successful collaboration for their learners.

Registration: Includes all of the days and times your educators are available for best matching potentials, limited days and times can cause a group to go unmatched. You will receive an email confirmation, should you not please send an email to <a href="info@cilc.org">info@cilc.org</a>.

**Scheduling:** We invite you to download the planning templates linked in the RAP Resource section, **Should you be coordinating for multiple schools, we suggest you dedicate a day to RAP connections per school** so you can more easily assist educators.

**Tech Check:** Test calls should be conducted between partners. We suggest **authentic** tech check, by having educators connect with the same equipment and location they will on the day of their RAP connection. Complete test calls a week in advance of RAP.

**Rescheduling:** While we stress commitment to RAP, we understand life, or technology, can happen. We suggest that **you have educators plan a back-up date and also identify the contact information for the main contact** should a life, school, or tech event occur.

### **Technical Requirements**

All RAP connections will be held via video call connection. This requires each educator to connect with their partner teacher using a mobile, desktop, or videoconferencing unit. Based on school guidelines, partners decide their connection platform: Zoom, Google Meets, BlueJeans, WebEx, etc. If a virtual room is needed, CILC can provide meeting rooms if necessary.

### **Phase II: Partner Assignment**

All <b>partner</b> emails have been reviewed and verified that our site's information is correct.
Ensure all educators have accessed their Resource folder
Confirm that educators have reached out to partner about test call date
Identified connection location, equipment, and connection method
Provided or received the link for RAP Connection to be used on test call and event
My Event Chart holds all contact, program, and technical details
Necessary test calls are scheduled and all details noted on Event Chart
Equipment is in working order and connection was successful
(If applicable) Re-tested and found solutions from previous test call that was unsuccessful
(if applicable) Connection date(s) and time(s) were arranged with the regional office.

### **Phase III: Presentation Preparation**

Ran through how technology will be used during the RAP connection
Assisted educators with activities and presentations for the RAP event
Reviewed the run through of the RAP event with educators
All educators have a digital and/or physical copy of their Teacher Packet
I have confirmed that partner teachers or coordinators are prepared for the event
Registered all educators for the Kick-Off RAP Event hosted by CILC

## **Phase IV: RAP Activity Days**

Confirmed all educators will arrive 5-10 minutes early
Have all essential contact information: room phone, tech contact, troubleshooting
Made schedule to ensure I am able to assist each educators with connections
